Your best resource for the Life to Eagle Scout experience is your district advancement chair and/or Eagle Scout coordinators. These volunteers will assist you with the project concept and approvals. Each Spring and Fall, the districts offer either an Eagle Preview or Eagle Expo to help Star and Life Scouts understand the process of earning the Eagle Scout rank. Check out your district website to see when the next Preview or Expo is offered.
